

Professor Ron Sanchez is a police captain with nearly thirty years of experience that includes assignments in a myriad of positions including undercover, patrol, foot-beats, surveillance, detectives, gangs, homicide, Internal Affairs, stakeouts, and multiple presidential and other VIP protection details. In his capacity as a police officer he promoted through the ranks of police officer, detective, sergeant, lieutenant and captain.

Ron has been an active martial arts student since 1971, and has studied several martial arts. Ron was a driving force in two youth development programs for inner- city youths in South-Central Los Angeles and in the Hollywood Community. These programs serve hundreds at-risk kids in variety of educational and athletic activities including literacy skills, academic tutoring, martial arts (Kenpo and Jiu-Jitsu) roller hockey, soccer, theater, boxing and gymnastics.

Mr. Sanchez was invited as a representative to the 1997 Presidential Summit on Youth Development. Mr. Sanchez attended the Summit with Mr. John Travolta, an active supporter of the Hollywood youth development in literacy skills.

Ron has been featured as an actor, both on screen or as a voice over artist and stuntman in several television and film presentations including, Sword of Heaven, To Live or Die in L.A., Rampage, Twilight, and Man on the Moon. Ron has also been featured in four episodes of J.A.G. and other television and theatrical productions.

Mr. Sanchez is a licensed pilot and a certified open water, advanced and Rescue SCUBA Diver. He is a member of several professional associations including the Latin American Law Enforcement Officers' Association, the Hispanic Law Enforcement Administrators' Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, a Life Member in the National Rifle Association, the Professional Association of Underwater
